What will I get out of this training session?

You'll learn:

- how to identify threats to security
- what to do in an emergency and who to contact
- why it's important to learn and follow procedures

What is Faith Security Training?

Delivered by CDS on behalf of the Home Office, FST is entry-level security training for anyone connected with a place of worship.

It's been designed alongside CST training, so is completely appropriate for a synagogue. The BHHC security team has organised this day training session for the benefit of the Brighton & Hove Jewish community, supported by the use of BNJC's events space.

Who can join the FST session on Sunday 1 November?

The session is open to anyone from the BHHC/BNJC community.

You don't have to be in the security team to get something out of this opportunity - it's actually designed for you.

Why should I join the FST session if we already have security and CST volunteers on site?

It's a unique opportunity for members of the BHHC/BNJC community to learn together about basic principles of security measures and risk scenarios.

If you've ever wondered what goes through the head of a security guard or CST volunteer, now is the time to find out in a collaborative, safe environment.

It's an all-day session, how will I eat?

Kosher lunch and refreshments are provided. You're welcome to bring snacks with you, they must be kosher, just please don't eat during the training and eat during the breaks.
